III. MAKING THE CHOICE:

A. There Are Problems:

- 1. There will always be problems to face in life no matter where we live, where we work or go to church, situations of difficulty will arise.
- 2. There was no question that there was a problem in the situation with the widows in Acts 6, and the normal human reaction was that some people murmured and complained. Acts 6:1

B. There Are Solutions:

- 1. Every problem has a <u>solution</u> it's just that most people will sit and look at the <u>problem</u> and discuss the problem and probably <u>complein</u> about it, yet do nothing to fix it.
- 2. In Acts 6, the leadership of the Apostles found the <u>solution</u> to the problem and put in motion a plan of action to <u>remady</u> the situation. Acts 6:2-3
