III. MAKING THE CHOICE:

A. *There Are Problems:*

B. *There Are Solutions:*

1. Every problem has a solution - it's just that most people will sit and look at the problem and discuss the problem and probably complain about it, yet do nothing to fix it.
2. In Acts 6, the leadership of the Apostles found the solution to the problem and put in motion a plan of action to remedy the situation. Acts 6:2-3

C. *Which Will You Become?:*

1. We all have the power of choice and only each of us personally can decide whether we will be a problem seer or a solution finder.
2. It takes zero effort to be a negative naysayer – most of the people in the world are caught up in the negative mindset and see only problems and never any solutions.
3. You can become a solution finder if you will change your thinking patterns from the negative to the positive and begin to pray and speak in faith on a daily basis. Mt. 11:23
